9. Teaching

A. Courses Developed and Taught by Me

Graduate Level

Sociological Theories and Perspectives of the Family

This course explores the ways in which the family is socially structured and serves various economic, gender, ethnic and national interests. Students who complete the course become familiar with the main theoretical approaches that deal with family research, and able to critically analyze the social processes that shape the family.

<u>Organizational Sociology- Theory and Practice</u>

This course introduces the main theoretical foundations for the sociological understanding of organizations. Students who complete the course acquire sociological knowledge of organizational structures and processes, and of the reciprocal relations between organizations and society. Students are also developing during the course the ability to critically analyze organizations.

Advanced Writing Skills

Clear, accurate, well-reasoned, organized writing, done in accordance with the citation rules, is not merely a technical matter, but is a prerequisite for the creation of high quality and successful academic work. The purpose of this course is to become acquainted with the basics of academic writing. It provides tools for the preparation and writing of academic papers and discusses relevant topics, including structure and organization of academic papers, choosing a topic for academic work, choosing theoretical anchors, writing a literature review, introduction and discussion, academic writing style, learning the citation method in APA method and academic writing rules.

<u>Undergraduate level</u>

Ethnicity in Comparative Perspective

This seminar follows—as it examines case studies in Europe, the United States and Israel—the different ways in which sociological research conceptualizes the meaning of the ethnic category. The goals of the seminar are to introduce the knowledge about the ethnic category and its impact on social processes, to provide tools for the analysis of social structures and processes, while applying sociological theories, and to develop the tools for writing a research seminar.

The Social and Cultural Structures of the Israeli Society

This course deals with the analysis of the main processes that shape the Israeli society from the time of the pre-state until the present time. It critically examines various systems such as the Israeli education system, the Israeli army, immigration absorption, as well as the main divisions that characterize the Israeli society: Jewish-Arab relations, the class rift, the ethnic hierarchy and the gaps between women and men. The main goals of the course are to introduce the sociological knowledge about the structure of the Israeli society, to provide tools—sociological theories— for the analysis of the Israeli society and to develop a critical approach to social processes.

Introduction to Sociology

The course focuses on central sociological and anthropological approaches as a basis for understanding the organization of the society and the accompanying cultural system. Emphasis is placed on understanding the ways interactions between individuals, groups and institution reproduce or change social order. Among the various aspects that discussed are the essence of social sciences, social thinking, processes of globalization, the crystallization of norms, values and cultural codes, socialization and social learning and stratification and inequality. Special emphasis is placed on the mutual influences that exist between social and cultural processes.

Inequality Displays within the Israeli Society

The main goal of the course is to demonstrate the various dimensions of inequality in Israel. It examines first the inequality in central social structures such as the Israeli education system and the Israeli army, and moves then to analyze the main divisions that characterize the Israeli society: the Jewish-Arab relations, the class rift, the ethnic hierarchy and the gaps between women and men in the labor market.

False Consciousness, Suspicion and Meaning

This course discusses the ways the critical and mainly neo-Marxist emphasis on liberal values of justice and equality led to the perception of different social groups as detached from the 'real' social reality. In the face of these sociological approaches that "suspect" the objects of their research, I present the analysis of the post-liberal approach of contemporary issues such as ultra-orthodox women's coping with male domination and the adaptation of Bedouin women in urban communities. This analysis emphasizes the meaning worlds of the groups

studied instead enables the production of new research knowledge and the empowering of disadvantaged groups in society.

Introduction to Writing Skills

The purpose of this course is to become acquainted with the basics of academic writing. It provides tools for the preparation and writing of academic papers and discusses relevant topics, including structure and organization of academic papers, choosing a topic for academic work, academic writing style and academic writing rules.
